**DOMESTIC VIOLENCE REGISTER
KIRIBATI POLICE**

Domestic violence includes all physical, sexual and 'mental' violence, between people who are, or have been in a 'domestic relationship'. People that could be involved could include parents, children, husbands, wives, relatives, boyfriends, girlfriends, or other 'close' relationships.

Remember you must report all cases where police provide help – not only when you arrest but also when you settle the matter at the time. Information we need in the Domestic Violence Register includes:

Domestic Violence Number	Shows the incident number, followed by the year (eg 03/01 indicating the 3rd case in 2001).
Case File number	Case file number assigned by O/C Station.
Reported Date/Time	Date and time the incident is reported to Police.
Complainant's Particulars	Details of the complainant including their name, age and address
Injury to Complainant	Was the complainant injured (YES/NO)? If YES, note the extent of injuries such as minor (scratches) or serious (required medical or hospital treatment).
Details of report	Note down the time, date and place of the incident. Briefly describe the circumstances.

Details of Accused	Details of the accused including name, address, age, and their relationship with the complainant.
Children who Witness Violence	Did children see or hear the violence? If they did, write down how many children saw or heard the violence.
Alcohol/Drugs Involved	Note down whether either the accused and/or the complainant were affected by alcohol or drugs. Draw two columns (One for the complainant, one for the accused.)
Weapons Involved	Was a weapon such as a knife, or stick used in the incident? If so, what kind of weapon was used? (It is very important to know this information as it helps protect other police officers that may attend at a later time.)
Police action	What action did the attending police take? For example, was the matter settled at the scene, was the matter sent to Court, is further enquiries by Police required, or are Police working with another department that can help?
Result	What was the final result? (For example, what was the result of a Court hearing, or the result of Police enquiries?)
